

IEEE Rudolf Chope Research & Development Award

Established: 2008

Description: To recognize distinguished research and development accomplishment in quantum and industrial electronics and for industrial electrical engineering.

Administration: The Industrial Electronics Society (IES) and The IEEE Foundation

Eligibility: IES members

Prize: US\$1,000 and certificate(s) Multiple recipients will divide the prize.

Funding: Funded by the Rudolf Chope Award Fund, provided by Chope Family Bypass Trust, and IES.

Presentation: At the Society's major international conference

Other notes: This awarded is given annually. The award is not necessarily given; it is awarded only when suitable candidates are identified, and when the IEEE Foundation confirms expenditure authority.

Operational details:

Nominee solicitation: Calls for nominations are announced in the IEEE Industrial Electronics Magazine and the society's website.

Deadlines: Nominations may be submitted at any time, but only those received by April 1 will be considered for judging in the same year. Nominations received after April 1 will be considered for the next year.

Judging criteria: For distinguished R&D achievement in industrial and/or quantum electronics.

Award recommendation: IES A&H Committee must receive confirmation from the IEEE Foundation. IES A&H Committee will review nomination materials. The recommended award recipient will be the result of the Committee vote. A&H Committee will present the recommendation to IES AdCom for final approval at the summer AdCom meeting.

Publicity: The award winner(s) will be publicized in the IEEE

Industrial Electronics Magazine and on the IEEE Industrial
Electronics Society website.
